<b>Description:</b>	<p><b>CINDI seeks to implement programme aimed at providing services to Orphaned and Youth through the provision of comprehensive and coordinated evidence-based intervention that strengthen the capacity of families and communities in EThekwini and UMgungundlovu. The objectives are as follows:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a) To improve OVCA&amp;Y access to sexual reproductive health and HIV care and preventative services through related small group evidence-based interventions, facilitating access to HTS and successful linkages to ART's, contraceptives and other health services. It will also provide psychosocial and psychological support to infected, bereaved OVCA&amp;Y and victims of abuse.</li> <li>b) To improve child protection and prevention of gender based violence (GBV) through direct support to OVCA&amp;Y, their primary caregivers and the community.</li> <li>c) To improve household economic security and linkage to social protection through provision of training and support to both OVCA&amp;Y and their primary care givers.</li> </ul>

## Background

The Children in Distress Network (CINDI), founded in July 1996, is a multi-sectoral network of over 200 civil society organisations capable of implementing diverse, effective and sustainable programmes for children and youth infected or affected by HIV & AIDS. In 2003/4 CINDI was funded by Irish Aid to establish a funding conduit to strengthen the financial resource mobilisation of its members. These would in turn strengthen the capacity of members, non-government and community-based organisations to provide care and support to children and young people made vulnerable by HIV and AIDS through both funding and a capacity development initiative.

CINDI is seeking applications from civil society organisations or Non-Profit entities that will implement a programme targeted a providing services to Orphaned and Vulnerable Children Adolescents and Youth (OVCA&Y) within EThekwini District. CINDI has been funded by the American people through PEPFAR and USAID to support organisations working in communities in scaling up support to the

## Programme Scope of Work and Targets

### Scope:

The programme seeks applicant organisation that have access to children and families within EThekwini District municipal wards. Applicant organisations must have the ability to access targeted populations through multiple entry points with a particular focus on the children fitting the following criteria:

- Child living with HIV.
- Child who is single or double orphan.
- HIV exposed infant.
- Child living with an HIV positive caregiver.
- Adolescent Girl Young Woman at risk of getting HIV.
- Survivor of Gender Based Violence.
- Child of a caregiver who is a member of a Key Population Group.
- Child of an absent parent or who's where about is unknown.

The applicant organisation will need to have access to and the ability to manage a cadre caseworkers/caregivers for performance.

The scope of services provided to OVCA&Y will include the following

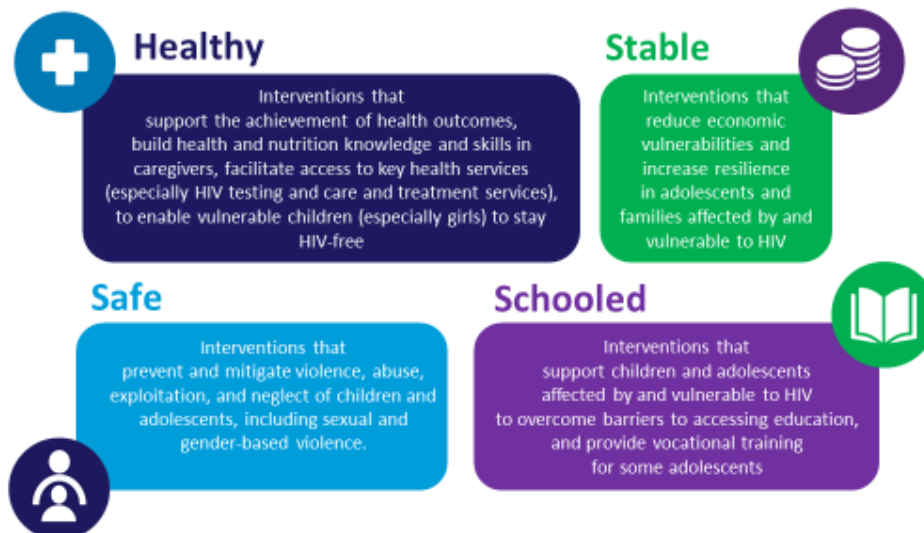
- Providing Direct OVCY Case Management
- HIV, GBV and IPV Risk Assessment
- Identification and linkage to care HIV+
- High impact HIV, TB, STI and SRH referrals
- Monitor school attendance and progression
- Provide evidence based programs
  - Vhutshilo 1
  - Vhutshilo 2
  - Vuthshilo 3
  - Let's Talk
  - Impumelelo (Financial Capabilities Programme)

Ideally applicant organisations should have previous experience in implementation of the above mentioned services. Proven working relationship with local health service points will be an advantage.
